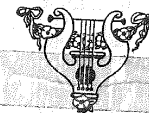

DR. FRANK SIMON

Frank Simon, internationally famous bandmaster and corner virtuoso, was born in Cincinnati, Ohio, November 28, 1889, and received most of his musical education in that city of traditional musical culture. When only eleven he showed exceptional talent for the corner and soon attracted the attention of the eminent corner master and military band expert, Herman Bellstedt. Under Bellstedt's guiding genius he developed with amazing rapidity, and while still in his teens was featured as soloist during the tours of well known professional bands.

Acclaimed as a front rank virtuoso, he was offered a position with the Sousa Band, and it was not long before he became the premier soloist and assistant conductor of the Sousa organization. His phenomenal performances and superb artistry made him a great favorite with Sousa audiences everywhere.

Frank Simon is past-president of The American Bandmasters' Association, and was one of the organizers of this Association. Many honors and distinctions have been accorded him, among them being a Doctor of Music degree conferred upon him at Columbus, Ohio, in 1930 in recognition of his untiring efforts for the advancement of bands throughout the country. In 1932, he was appointed Director of the Band Department of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music.

Frank Simon has been hailed as "a dynamic conductor, master showman, and colorful personality," but the thing that has afforded him the greatest pleasure is the knowledge that he has brought inspiration and pleasure to millions through the radio broadcasts of his famous band.

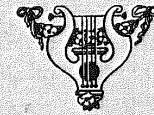

MR. FREDERICK FENNEL

Frederick Fennell was born in Cleveland, Ohio, July 2, 1914. His first musical experiences were as a drummer, at the age of six, in his family's drum corps. During his high school days he became an expert percussionist, spending the intervening summers at the National Music Camp, Interlochen, Michigan, where he also began the study of conducting.

Attracting the attention of prominent music educators, he became a scholarship student at the Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester, where he was soon a "reformed percussionist" and was put in charge of the football band. At the close of the gridiron season he moved the band indoors, convinced Dr. Howard Hanson, head of the Eastman School, that he should become a member of the staff and organized the first symphonic band at the school. He was subsequently made a member of the conducting staff, and studied at Salzburg under an International Fellowship.

Mr. Fennell was an assistant to Serge Koussevitzky, at the Berkshire Music Center, during the summer of 1948. He has traveled all over the country, appearing as guest conductor for prominent musical organizations, including the Boston "Pops" Orchestra and the Houston, Texas, Symphony Orchestra. During the late war he served in the capacity of a National USO Music Advisor.

He has been a frequent guest conductor of various All-State high school orchestras and bands, and has brought much inspiration to young musicians everywhere.

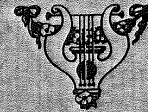

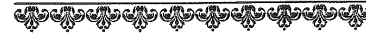

DR. ERNEST E. HARRIS

Associate Professor of Music Education
Columbia University

Ernest E. Harris was born in Gadsden, Alabama, August 26, 1914. His music career started at the age of nine when he was a student of the violin. Later he studied the trombone and during his high school and college years he performed on both instruments professionally. His musicianship was followed by given staff members of the Cincinnati Conservatory and he was given a full scholarship to complete a sound musical background.

At Catawaba College in North Carolina, he completed a four year course in music education. Upon earning his B.A. degree, he studied at Juilliard Institute of Music in New York City and later attended Columbia University for graduate study. At the later university he was awarded a Master's Degree and a Doctorate.

Dr. Harris has varied experiences in the field of music education; teaching from the elementary to the college graduate level. At present he is an associate professor of music education at Columbia University. He is a member of the Acoustical Society of America; The Music Teacher's National Association; Phi Delta Kappa; Member of the National Music Council; National President of the American String Teachers' Association; National Chairman of the committee on "Instrumental Music in the Schools," for the MENC, and is also Province Governor of the Phi Mu Alpha, National Honorary Music Fraternity.

As a composer for band and orchestra organizations, Dr. Harris is known as a person who writes with thought and feeling. He has appeared at many state and national clinics as conductor and lecturer.

Dr. Harris is married to Evelyn Arthurs and has two children; Rose Marie, age 12, and Ernest, Jr., age 10.

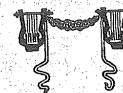

Mark Hindsley received his A.B. and A.M. degrees from Indiana University and in 1925 became Director of Bands for his alma mater. From 1929 to 1934 he was Director of Instrumental Music in Cleveland Heights, Ohio, where he did outstanding work. In 1934 he became Assistant Director of Bands to A. A. Harding at the University of Illinois. His work in this capacity was interrupted by the war in which he contributed his efforts as Music Officer of the Air Force Training Command. His military service lasted from 1942 to 1946 and his final rank was that of Lieutenant Colonel. Returning to Illinois he became Director of Bands and Professor of Music in 1948. He has also done summer teaching at many colleges and universities.

Mr. Hindsley is greatly in demand as a guest conductor, adjudicator, and clinic leader, and he has appeared in these capacities throughout most of the United States. He is the author of several books and articles on bands and instrumental music education. He is a member of many music organizations, and is past-president of the College Band Directors National Association.

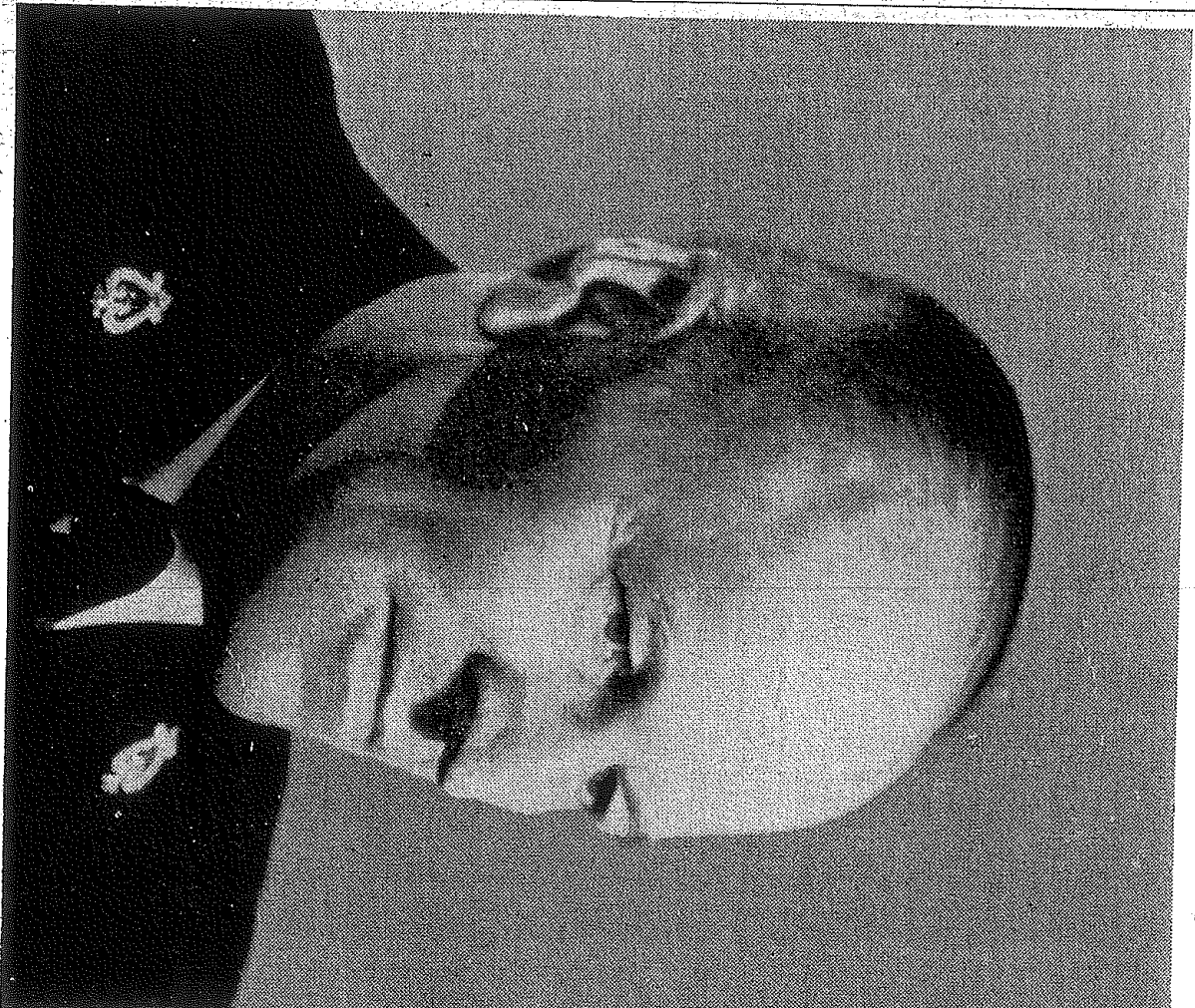

Raymond Dvorak

Raymond Francis Dvorak, Professor of Music at the University of Wisconsin and the Director of Bands, was born in 1900 at Algonquin, Illinois and was educated at the University of Illinois, where he received a B.S. and later a B.M., and at the Chicago Musical College. He studied piano with Cornelia Smith, Agnes Petersen, Henri Van Den Berg, Edward Collins, and Henry McNeal.

Dvorak was director of Music in the Urbana, Illinois High School from 1922 to 1926, during which time his high school choruses won first prize in state competition. His orchestra and grade school band also won first prizes in state competition. He was

on the music faculty of the University of Illinois from 1922 to 1934 as assistant director of bands, drillmaster of the football bands, and director of the Men's and Women's Glee Clubs.

He was a member of the summer school music faculties of the Chicago Musical College; the National Music Camp at Interlochen, Michigan; the Juilliard School of Music; the Emporia State Teachers College, Kansas; and the University of California at Los Angeles. He has given lectures and demonstrations at many schools and colleges, including the Vandercook School of Music in Chicago, the Arthur Jordan Conservatory of Mu-

Dale C. Harris, Supervisor of Instrumental Music in the Public Schools of Pontiac, Michigan, has worked for years to further the advancement of instrumental music in the schools.

Active in Michigan school instrumental music programs for more than twenty-five years, Mr. Harris helped organize the Southeastern Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association in 1953 and the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association the following year. He was unanimously elected president of the American School Band Directors' Association, which he helped organize, and served for two terms. He is now a member of the Board of Directors of the Association and General Chairman of the Committee for the Improvement of School Bands.

In addition to his continuous efforts in regional, state, and national music organizations, Mr. Harris has remained a dedicated and efficient leader in the local instrumental music program of his own city. Under his direction since its inception, the Pontiac High School Band has maintained since 1931 an unequalled record in District and State Competitions, and in the last Regional interstate competition of the National Contest in 1940 received a First Division Award.

Musicianship, however, rates second to development of student citizenship in the philosophy of Pontiac's instrumental music program. Under Mr. Harris' guidance both musicianship and citizenship are constantly stressed as the ultimate objectives of the program, with festival and contest competitions serving only as measures of achievement in these important areas.

MAJOR WILLIAM H. SCHEMPF

Major William H. Schempf, a native of Wisconsin, received his early musical education in the public schools of Madison, Wisconsin, and at the National Music Camp, Interlochen, Michigan. His Bachelor of Music degree was received in 1939 from the University of Wisconsin, where he was elected to the National Honor Society, Phi Kappa Phi. Subsequently, he was awarded a fellowship for graduate study at the Eastman School of Music, University of Rochester, and in 1941 he completed the Master of Music degree.

Major Schempf served in the Army during World War II, receiving a commission in the field of Meteorology. He was discharged with the rank of Captain. From the fall of 1947 until 1952, he was director of the department of music at Lehigh University. In that year, he received a Fulbright award for continue study in Vienna, Austria. During the past two years, he was selected to participate in the conductors workshop of the Cleveland Orchestra, directed by George Szell, and the Philadelphia Orchestra under Ormandy. Major Schempf assumed his duty as Director of Music and Commanding Officer of the United States Military Academy Band in June of 1957.

The Twentieth Annual New Jersey All State Band Festival and Clinic will be held at Woodbridge High School March 6, 7, 8, 1959. Representing the best high school band musicians in our state, will be one hundred and fifty students from all parts of New Jersey. The three day festival will end with the annual concert Sunday afternoon conducted by L. Bruce Jones, director of bands from Louisiana State University. The band is indeed fortunate to have as its conductor Mr. Jones who is one of the nation's leading guest conductors and clinicians. Appearing in many state and national band festivals, Mr. Jones conducted the All Eastern Band in Atlantic City, New Jersey in 1957 at the M.E.N.C. Eastern Convention.

Mr. Jones began his musical ascendancy in Little Rock, Arkansas in 1926, where he built one of the South's top high school bands. Under his conductorship, the Little Rock high school band consistently won first place in state and national competition. In 1931 Mr. Jones was honored by being elected the first president of the newly organized Arkansas School Band Association. Through his efforts, the Dixie School Band and Orchestra Association was formed. From 1936 to 1940 he also served as Chairman of Region Seven of the National School Band Association. For six years he also served as president of the National School Band Association. Mr. Jones has served for many years in various capacities on the Executive Board of the M.E.N.C. and has appeared as guest conductor of organizations at the National and Sectional Conferences.

In 1942, Mr. Jones became director of the Arkansas State Symphony Orchestra, an organization in which he had previously served as concertmaster for three seasons. At the same time he was director of the Immanuel Baptist Church which gained an outstanding reputation throughout the

South. Since 1945, he has been director of the First Baptist Choir of Baton Rouge, one of the outstanding choirs in the Southern Convention.

For the past thirteen years, L. Bruce Jones has been at Louisiana State University where he is Director of Bands and Chairman of Music Education. His university band at L. S. U. has grown to be one of the nation's half-time favorites during the football season. Because of his outstanding administrative ability and leadership in the field of band music, he was elected in 1949, as president of the College Band Directors National Association. The highest professional honor bestowed upon a band director, came to Mr. Jones when he was elected to membership in the American Bandmaster's Association.

Mr. Jones is listed in "Who's Who in America", "Who's Who in Music", "First Chair of America", and "Leaders in Education." His text book "Building the Instrumental Music Department," published by Carl Fischer, is used by many high schools and colleges in America.

Seating try-outs for the All State Band will be held at Hightstown High School on March 1, 1959, with Edgar Thomas and Joseph Clouser serving as co-chairmen. The try-outs will start at 2:00 p.m. with directors from various schools throughout the state working on the audition committee. Ticket chairman this year will be Phil Waron of Carteret High School, who has been an active member of the All State Band program for a number of years.

The clinic, which is always an important feature of the All State Band Festival, is under the chairmanship of Herman Toplansky. Through his professional contacts Mr. Toplansky has secured David Weber, eminent clarinetist. He will present an artist recital on Friday, March 6, at 2:00 p.m. followed by a short discussion period.
